

Robyn's horse became foot sore early into the ride and returned to base.


A big thank you to Bob for pre-riding the route and also to Katrina for looking after the sign on book and collecting the lunch money.

KILCOY SHOW REPORT

Our Outback Riders were on the road again on Saturday 10th May bound for Kilcoy where our team was booked to perform Outback Riders and The Man From Snowy River. The Outback Riders show went well despite Jarrod's horse losing it's footing and landing them both in the dirt. Thankfully both the horse and rider were okay apart from a minor injury to Jarrod's wrist.

According to one of our crew sitting in the audience we were all over Facebook by the end of our performance with people frantically messaging their friends to come and see the evening performance of The Man From Snowy River.

After a well deserved rest for both horses and riders we kitted up for our performance of "The Man From Snowy River". OLDEST HORSE ON RECORD: Old Billy was the longest lived horse on record. Old Billy was verified to be 62 years old at his death.

Old Billy was born in 1760 in Woolston, Lancashire and worked as a barge horse, dragging barges in the canals from the shore for Mersey and Irwell Navigation. (This was a common job for horses prior to the arrival of boat engines.)

Old Billy was said to look like a big cob/shire horse. He was brown with a white blaze. On 27th November 1822 Billy died. His lithograph was published, showing Old Billy, with Henry Harrison, who had known the animal for 59 years.

Old Billy was depicted in a lithograph from 1820, rather late into his twilight years, showing him near the Lancashire town of Warrington and the canal where he worked with Squire Henry Harrison who is said to have "known the horse for 59 years," whatever that means. He was also painted by an artist named W. Taylor, a portrait that shows him again posed against the canal with the spires of Manchester Cathedral in the back-ground, a work that's now held by the Warrington Museum & Art Gallery.

Billy's skull now resides in Manchester Museum. His taxidermied head is on display in Bedford Museum.

THE EQUINE HEART—an excerpt taken from "Heart Sounds: Rate, Rhythm & Recovery" by Dr Jennifer Stewart in Hoofbeats magazine p18, Vol 35 No 1, June July 2013 published by Hoofbeat Publications 90 Leslie Rd, Wandi, 6167.

"The equine heart is unequalled—at rest pumping up to 45 litres of blood every minute and, at maximum speed, up to 500 litres per minute. The superiority of the equine cardiovascular system rests in a proportionately larger heart mass than other large mammals. The Thoroughbred's heart weighs just over 1% of its body weight, an Arabian's about 0.76% and a draft horse's about 0.6% of its body weight.

The hearts of Thoroughbred racehorses Eclipse– unbeaten in 26 races, and Phar Lap winner of 57 races—weighed **over 6kg**, 20% larger than that of an average Thoroughbred.

US Triple Crown winner, Secretariat, had a heart that weighed over 10kg."
