Last Ride: Mount Nombi by Liz

Our last ride was held on the property Mt Nombi owned by the Adams family. The Trek out to the property takes you through the small village of Mullaley about 40km south of Gunnedah past Mullaley Mountain. John Oxley passed over the Coxs Creek at the base of this mountain in 1818 and named the fertile basalt black soil plains The Liverpool Plains . A further 20km on at the base of Mount Telbereeeya is the 8000 acre property Mt Nombi where we were lucky enough to spend the next couple of days riding the boundaries, the gullies and the peaks.



We camped in the open at the cattle yards under the stars, blessed with beautiful weather, and at night the stars beaming and the quietness that would hear a pin drop.

The Saturday afternoon ride began with a brief meet and greet and pre-ride talk. Sixteen anxious riders and even more anxious horses headed off to explore the western boundaries of the property skirting around the base of another small basalt mountain (phenolite lava dome) called Kiadmoot. 16kms later, incident free, we arrive back at camp just before dark and with enough daylight left to get the horses fed and put to bed. Happy hour turned into happy hours and with the day now well and truly behind us, our beds provided some welcome and comforting relief.



Before we knew it the night had slipped us by and once again horses were being un-rugged and fed. With body and soul rejuvenated (coffee, bacon and eggs and the like) horses groomed and saddled and another pre-ride talk, we set off for another exciting exploration of the south and eastern boundaries. This time we headed to higher ground to capture the panoramic views of the Mullaley area and Western edges of the Liverpool Plains. Although the soil is soft and self mulching under hoof the constant clash of steel against rock reminded us of the importance to have well shod horses.



Although the recent rain in the area was very welcome and was starting show its worth with tinges of green appearing across the hills and flats, the lack of ground cover, the stark contrast of white dead trees against grey-green living trees as you look up the



mountain-side, the dominating black brown colours across the landscape and the stock self feeders dotted across the paddocks tell the story of one of the worst droughts in history.

Having closed the gates, checked the troughs and stock, 16 lucky boundary riders returned back to camp around 12.30 for a well earned drink and bite to eat. A quick concise meeting was held and reluctantly we pack up camp load the horses and leave Mt Nombi with memories of a beautiful property, a well organised and enjoyable ride in the company of great people (and Horses).
